This year allowed me to teach Web Development as a full-year course. The full-year course allowed me to approach all the different aspects of Web Development that I wanted to address this year: design, styling, tables, and css. As part of the curriculum, students were required to use CyberLearning's Web Publishing course to learn the different aspects we were to address this year. Many of the students took the "bull by the horns" and jumped into CyberLearning and showed great prowess with the topics covered by having a huge percentage increase between the pre-test and the post-test. Some students were slower than others and did not complete the course as required, but showed progress nevertheless with the lessons completed.

CyberLearning is an integrated portion of my classroom learning and students are encouraged to use it after they have completed lessons and when at home. Many of my students are Mac users and they were thrilled to see CyberLearning ported over to the Mac OS. I will continue to use CyberLearning with each year, making it a more important portion of my curriculum. It is my hope that CyberLearning will add a CSS specific course as well as additional teaching materials for teachers to use, such as Web-design projects and hands-on projects.
